

Publication of Student Diversity Data

5 January 2017

The Specific duties of the Equality Act 2010 require public bodies to;-

- publish information relating to employees who share protected characteristics
- publish information relating to people who are affected by the public body's policies and practices (e.g. students)

The following information is designed to give an overall indication of the position of the University with respect to those protected characteristics about which data is currently collected. It is used to guide further equalities work and further analysis may be possible where there are particular concerns.

Please note that where figures are given for UK HEI's (Higher Education Institutes), these are for the Academic Year 2014/15 which are the latest available. The UK HEI figures are based on data provided by the Equality Challenge Unit which provides representations of the protected characteristics for all staff in UK HEI's.

Notes:

The percentages in brackets indicate last year's representation (produced 4 January 2016 for University of Leicester and Academic year 2013/2014 for UK Data)

The University began collecting information relating to sexual orientation and religion/belief for students in academic year 2016/2017 and therefore there are no previous year's comparisons for these.

The representation of UK Domiciled BME students at the University has increased by 3.9%. In comparison to the representation of BME Students in the UK, Leicester has a significantly higher proportion of BME students, which is 15.7% above the national representation. The overall disclosure for the ethnicity of students is 98.3%.

There are 3.1% more White students compared with BME students from the total student population. The total student BME population is significantly higher than the UK Domiciled student BME population (44.9% all students compared with 36.7% UK Domiciled). There has been a significant decrease of 6.8% for Not Known for all students however this is still high in comparison to Leicester's UK Domiciled students (1.7%).

The University has provided statistics for Sexual Orientation for the first time this year, the figure for Heterosexual staff is 14.7% higher than the national representation, while the percentage of Not Known is 16.3% lower.

The University disclosure rates are 14.8% higher than the national representation specifically, those who declared 'No religion' is 7.8% higher and declared religion is 11.6% higher than the national figures.

The University percentages are higher than the national figures in many of the categories the highest of which are; No religion at 7.9%, Muslim at 3.9% and Christian at 3.8% higher than the national figure. As above has already the disclosure rate is 14.8% higher than the national figure and this may account for the higher rates of declared religious or non-religious identities.

The number of students attaining a First has increased by 4.8% for females and this representation is in line with the UK figures. The percentage of females achieving a 2.1 is higher than males by 9.5%. The number of both male and female students attaining a 2.2-Fail has remained approximately the same. In comparison to the UK average the University of Leicester have significantly lower numbers of students attaining 2.2 and below.

The UK representation for BME achieving a First has increased by 1.9%, however the percentage of BME students at the University achieving a First has increased by 6.3%. The number of BME and White students achieving a 2.1 has decreased. The attainment of both White and BME students attaining a 2.1 is higher than the UK representation for this degree classification. The number of BME students who have failed has approximately stayed the same whereas the number of White students who have failed has decreased.

The number of BME students attaining a 2.2-Pass is significantly higher than the proportion of White students attaining a 2.2-Pass, although the overall attainment of a 2.2-pass for our White and BME students is still lower than the UK representation. The number of Not Known ethnicity for students attaining 2.1 has decreased by 12.2%. The University has a higher number of BME and White students attaining 2.1 compared with the UK representation.
